 - a. Identify the principles of jurisdiction for a given situation
 - b. Explain the justice continuum
 - c. Differentiate between Civil Law, Criminal Law, a felony, and a misdemeanor
 - d. Explain the role of the prosecutor
 - e. Analyze the pros and cons of alternative sentencing to include community corrections
 - f. Explain community policing and the role it plays in the criminal justice system
- 4. Explain the relationship among justice, duty, societal issues and ethics
 - a. Interpret the meaning of serve and protect
 - b. Describe professional and ethical behaviors in the criminal justice profession
 - c. Explain the use of force continuum in criminal justice situations
