

ORG515: Dynamics of Power in Organizations

Credit Hours: 3

Course Description and Outcomes



Course Description:

In this course, students will identify influences of power in the organization. Students examine the role of leadership and human behaviors related to power issues encountered in organizations and consider the positive and negative outcomes of the influence of power from the perspectives of leader, manager, and team member.

Course Overview:

This course examines the issues of power, influence, and politics within organizations, which includes effective leader and follower strategies and power and influence tactics, and their effects on employee motivation. The student will examine individual approaches; identify, analyze, and critique their own political and negotiating styles; and review gender communication variances. The student will also develop strategies for improving organizational relationships, responding to political settings, and increasing their organizational influence. Finally, the student will examine emerging issues in leadership within a fast-paced, global business environment.

Course Learning Outcomes:

1. Compare and contrast power versus influence and their role in society.
2. Evaluate techniques for understanding, achieving, and positively applying power and influence.
3. Analyze factors that impact the politics of power.
4. Assess the motives and styles of diverse leaders

Option #1: Influence Tactics Paper

1. Provide a brief overview of the leader and the organization, the situation, and any other key players relevant to the situation.
2. Describe the specific unethical influence tactics that were used in the situation. Then, analyze those influence tactics in terms of the leader's overall leadership strategy and use of power within the organization.
3. What was the outcome of the situation? If you were the leader in that situation, what would you have done differently?

Module 8

PORTFOLIO PROJECT (275 points)

You have a choice between two Portfolio Projects. *Do not do both projects*. Identify your Portfolio Project choice in the title of your document.

Option #1: Leadership Analysis Paper

For this Portfolio Project paper, you will choose two leaders, one male and one female. These two leaders do not need to be from the same organization. One leader should be what you would consider “effective and successful” and the other should be what you would consider “ineffective and unsuccessful.”

Compare these two leaders regarding their leadership characteristics, use of power and influence, and how these relate to their effectiveness or lack of effectiveness within their respective organization.

The entire portfolio project is worth 35% of your overall grade for this course. Make sure to use research to back up your statements within the paper. You will need to address each of the following as they relate to your two leaders. Each element is worth equal value.

Instructions:

1. A brief background and organizational framework for each leader, including job title and general description, industry in which they work, number of subordinates they supervise, and their leadership level within the organization (lower level, middle level, executive level)
2. A comparison of the techniques used by each leader to gain power in his or her role within the organization
3. A comparison of how subordinates relate to each leader, including how much influence the subordinates have on each leader
4. An analysis of how each leader uses influence to change the behavior of other leaders, co-workers, and subordinates within the organization
5. A comparison of the techniques used by each leader to influence employee motivation
6. An analysis of self-destructive tendencies (dark characteristics) of each leader, and how these tendencies affect the organization
7. A comparison of how each leader rewards employees, and how effective the reward systems are
8. An analysis of which leadership theory best describes each leader and the reasons why you selected the leadership theory based on research

Requirements:

- Your paper must be 8–10 pages in length, not counting the required title, [abstract](#), and reference pages.
- You must back up your analysis with at least six references not used as required or recommended readings in this course. The CSU-Global Library is a good place to find these sources. You may also use additional credible sources including newspapers, trade journals, government reports, and white papers. You may not use Wikipedia in any CSU-Global course. You may use course required or recommended readings as additional sources over the required six references.
- Include a cover page denoting the paper title, your name, the course number and name, your instructor’s name, and the date you are making the submission.
- Include an outline or table of contents.
- Include a brief abstract statement summarizing your hypothesis or findings.
- Format your paper according to the [CSU-Global Guide to Writing and APA](#). Use APA citations where appropriate, and include an APA- formatted reference page at the end.

Option #2: Leadership Analysis Presentation

For this Portfolio Project presentation, you will choose two well-known leaders in different countries and cultures (for example, a leader from the United States and a leader from China). You will compare these two

leaders in terms of their leadership styles, their methods for gaining power and influence, and their success and effectiveness as a leader.

The entire portfolio project is worth 35% of your overall grade for this course. Make sure to use research to back up your statements within the paper. You will need to address each of the following as they relate to your two leaders. Each question is worth equal value.

Instructions:

- A brief background for each leader including a profile of the leader, the organization they work for, the country or culture in which they work, the industry in which they work, their leadership level within the organization (lower level, middle level, executive level), and any other relevant information
- An overview of the culture in which the leader holds a position of leadership
- A comparison of the techniques used by each leader to gain power in his or her role within the organization
- A comparison of how subordinates relate to each leader, including how much influence the subordinates have on each leader in his or her respective culture
- An analysis of how each leader uses influence to change the behavior of other leaders, co-workers, and subordinates based on his or her respective culture
- A comparison of the techniques used by each leader to influence employee motivation
- An analysis of self-destructive tendencies (dark characteristics) of each leader, and how these tendencies affect the leadership effectiveness
- An analysis of which leadership theory best describes each leader and the reasons why you selected the leadership theory based on research
- An evaluation of how successful the two leaders are in their respective cultures and ideas for how they could improve their effectiveness given the culture in which they are leaders

Requirements:

- Your presentation should be either a 5- to 8-minute video or 10-12 narrated slides with images and detailed speaker notes (between 75 to 100 words per slide), not counting the title and reference page slides, which you must include in both the video and slide presentation.
- You may use your smartphone, webcam, or other video recording device, PowerPoint or an internet-based program such as Prezi or Slide Rocket. Be sure to include the URL of your presentation when using internet-based tools. Paste the URL into a Word document and upload it with your presentation.
- You may also record your audio/video presentation using the Canvas tools.
- You must back up your analysis with at least six references not used as required or recommended readings in this course. The CSU-Global Library is a good place to find these sources. You may also use additional credible sources including newspapers, trade journals, government reports, and white papers. You may not use Wikipedia in any CSU-Global course. You may use course required or recommended readings as additional sources over the required six references.
