PJM560: PROJECT MANAGEMENT OFFICE (PMO)

Credit Hours: 3

COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OUTCOMES

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course emphasizes the Project Management Office (PMO). Students will learn the elements of a PMO, which includes defining and maintaining standards, policies, processes, and methods for project management within the organization. Learners will also identify the responsibilities of the Project Management Professional (PMP) to include guidance, documentation, and metrics related to the practices involved in managing and implementing projects within the organization. A PMO may also get involved in project-related tasks and follow up on project activities through completion. The office may report on project activities, problems, and requirements to executive management as a strategic tool in keeping implementers and decision-makers moving toward consistent, business- or mission-focused goals and objectives. Organizations around the globe are defining, borrowing, and collecting best practices in the process of project management and are increasingly assigning the PMO to exert overall influence and evolution of thought to continual organizational improvement. Prerequisite: PJM535.

COURSE OVERVIEW:

The purpose of this graduate level course is to help you understand the construct of the project management office (PMO) for optimally governing project performance and integrating project resources, tools, and practices throughout the enterprise. Beginning with an operational definition of the PMO, you will learn to recognize the differing PMO strategies based on various degrees of project control and oversight. Additionally, you will distinguish the purpose of the PMO from objectives of program, portfolio, and project management, while also examining the roles, responsibilities, and ethical concerns of the PMO throughout the project lifecycle phases and identifying the standards, tools, and techniques common to successful PMOs. You will evaluate business and ethical considerations, appropriate organizational structures, and different levels of project management maturity to determine the optimal PMO deployment for various types of organizations, including global companies. Building on this understanding, you will explore various professional career advancement opportunities typically centric to the PMO.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES:

1. Explain the key elements of a Project Management Office emphasizing global considerations.
2. Rationalize the main responsibilities of the PMO project management professional.
3. Formulate a project management office's mission statement, goals, and standards.
4. Evaluate project portfolio management techniques considering international influences.
5. Demonstrate proven practices of the project management office accentuating ethical consideration.
6. Describe the types and scope of project management offices.

- **PMO Definition:** Based on synthesis of the readings, module lecture, and your research, describe in your own words what the project management office (PMO) is and its purpose.
- **Project Management Environment:** Emphasize the PMO's distinction from portfolio, program, and project management. Identify three key PMO stakeholders and describe their interest. Identify and justify the common PMO types and structures.
- **PMO Value:** Explain how the PMO adds project management and enterprise value. Describe the PMO competency continuum framework and its five stages. Illustrate the PMO competency continuum for delivering sustainable PMO value.

Option #1: PMO Foundations Essay

For the assignment Option #1, write an essay to address the PMO Foundations Common Assignment Requirements.

Option #1: Recommendation for the Implementation of a New PMO

Option #2: Recommendation for the Advancement of an Existing PMO

For **Section 1: Subject Organization and Rationale** of the Portfolio Project, you are required to select a subject organization for developing a PMO recommendation. The subject organization must have an international/global aspect and may be your workplace, an organization that you are familiar with, or an organization that is based on your research.

For Option #1, the subject organization must exhibit the characteristics and attributes of a viable candidate for benefiting from a PMO.

For Option #2, the subject organization must exhibit a functioning PMO as qualified by the PMO competency continuum.

A key aspect of the Portfolio Project Section 1 is to secure instructor approval for the Portfolio Project subject organization selected, which is required before commencing with subsequent Portfolio Project sections.

 - Perceived PMO benefits for the organization:
 - Overarching business rationale
 - Long term measurable goals (2-3)
 - First year specific goals and metrics
 - Quantified value proposition (short and long term)

- Summarize how the PM assessment improves PMO success and business results while recognizing ethical considerations and challenges unique to an international PMO.

For **Section 2: PMO Mission, Charter, and Competency** of the Portfolio Project, you will build on the information detailed in your Portfolio Project Section 1. Based on analysis of your subject organization and further research, purpose the PMO's mission and vision, PMO charter, and PMO competency continuum stage resultant from your Option 1 or Option 2 recommendation. To this end, substantively address the following key elements for your subject organization's PMO recommendation:

- Develop the PMO's Mission and Vision including:
 - State the PMO's mission and vision.
 - Validate alignment with subject organization's mission and vision.
 - Designate key PMO stakeholders.
- Develop the PMO's Charter:
 - State the PMO's business purpose.
 - Describe the PMO's business alignment and affiliation.
 - Designate the PMO's empowerment authority.
 - Describe the PMO's fiscal management.
 - Identify the Charter approval.

- Include title and reference pages.
- In addition to your course textbook, cite at least four current (published within the past 5 years) scholarly resources (peer-reviewed, official governmental reports, and other scholarly sources) to support your suppositions, assertions, and conclusions. To enhance your learning experience, scholarly resources are available from the CSU Global library.
- Include an appendix for tables and figures as appropriate.

Portfolio Project: Section 3 (175 points)

The purpose of the Portfolio Project is to synthesize current research about the project management office (PMO) for the purpose of developing a PMO recommendation. The Portfolio Project is structured to help you demonstrate understanding of the course material, as well as the implications of new knowledge gained from research beyond the course readings and lectures.

Portfolio Project will be developed in three independent but cohesive sections, which considered in whole constitutes your PMO recommendation. The three sections are:

Section 1: Subject Organization and Rationale

Section 2: PMO Mission, Charter, and Competency

Section 3: PMO Recommendations

Sections 1 and 2 will be submitted as Portfolio Project milestones in Modules 3 and 6, respectively.

Section 3 will constitute your final Portfolio Project assignment, which due at the end of the course in Module 8.

Based on your Section 1 choice, one of the two PMO recommendation options will be performed for your Portfolio Project assignment, which are described as:

Option #1: Recommendation for the implementation of a new PMO

- or -

Option #2: Recommendation for the advancement of an existing PMO

For Section 1 (submitted in Week 3): Subject Organization and Rationale of the Portfolio Project, you are required to select a subject organization for developing a PMO recommendation. The subject organization must have an international/global aspect and may be your workplace, an organization that you are familiar with, or an organization that is based on your research.

- For Option 1, the subject organization must exhibit the characteristics and attributes of a viable candidate for benefiting from a PMO.
- For Option 2, the subject organization must exhibit a functioning PMO as qualified by the PMO competency continuum.

A key aspect of the Portfolio Project Section 1 is to secure instructor approval for the Portfolio Project subject organization selected, which is required before commencing with subsequent Portfolio Project sections.

Based on your research of the subject organization, substantively address the following key elements:

- Subject organization information:
 - Organization name
 - Organization's mission, vision, and values statement
 - Industry type and organization demographics
 - Description of organization's culture
 - Executive sponsor and key stakeholders
- PMO business case:
 - Assessment of existing project management:
 - Project management methods
 - Project management tools
 - Project management experience
 - Project management maturity
 - Perceived PMO benefits for the organization:
 - Overarching business rationale
 - Long term measurable goals (2-3)
 - First year specific goals and metrics
 - Quantified value proposition (short and long term)

For Section 2 (submitted in Week 6): PMO Mission, Charter, and Competency of the Portfolio Project, you will build on the information detailed in your Portfolio Project Section 1. Based on analysis of your subject organization and further research, purpose the PMO's mission and vision, PMO charter, and PMO competency continuum stage resultant from your Option 1 or Option 2 recommendation. To this end, substantively address the following key elements for your subject organization's PMO recommendation:

- Develop the PMO's Mission and Vision including:
 - State the PMO' mission and vision.
 - Validate alignment with subject organization's mission and vision.
 - Designate key PMO stakeholders.
- Develop the PMO's Charter:
 - State the PMO's business purpose.
 - Describe the PMO's business alignment and affiliation.

- Designate the PMO's empowerment authority.
- Describe the PMO's fiscal management.
- Identify the Charter approval.
- Relate to the PMO competency continuum
 - Designate the PMO competency continuum stage.
 - Justify the subject organization's designated PMO competency continuum stage determination.
 - Correlate the designated PMO competency continuum stage to the Organizational Project Management Maturity Model (OPM3).

For **Section 3 (submitted in Week 8): PMO Recommendations** of the Portfolio Project, you will build on the information detailed in your Portfolio Project Sections 1 and 2. Based on analysis of your subject organization and further research, develop either Option 1 or Option 2 recommendations for key aspects of the PMO that optimally support the subject organization's PMO framework as designated in Section 2. To this end, substantively address the following key elements for your subject organization's PMO recommendation:

- Designate recommendations, with appropriate rationale, for each of the following PMO key elements:
 - PMO type
 - PMO structure
 - PMO culture
 - PMO project methods
 - PMO project tools
 - PMO governance
 - PMO risk management
 - PMO business integration
 - PMO global challenges
 - Other relevant PMO considerations
- Recommend professional development for PMO advancement
 - Apply aspects of the project manager competency development (PMCD) framework for the PMO's professional development.
 - Designate professional certification requirements.
 - Describe mentorship role.
 - Identify project and portfolio leadership proficiencies.

Submit your Section 3 Portfolio Project final assignment as a single Microsoft Word document to the Module 8 submissions area established for this purpose.

Your essay should address the following requirements:

- Your well-written PMO recommendation essay thesis should be 12-14 pages in length, which does not include the title, reference, or appendix pages. You need to add headings and subheadings associated with each of the bullet points listed in the Section 3 requirements.
- Format your paper per the CSU Global Guide to Writing & APA standards, which includes an introduction and conclusion.
- Include title and reference pages.
- In addition to your course textbook, cite at least six current (published within the past 5 years) scholarly resources (peer-reviewed, official governmental reports, and other scholarly source) to support your suppositions, assertions, and conclusions. To enhance your learning experience, scholarly resources are available from the CSU Global library.
- Include an appendix for tables and figures as appropriate.
