Course Overview

In this course, you will delve into the discipline of health economics and demonstrate how knowledge, tools, and principles from this area can be applied to the current and future needs of health care organizations. Your assessment work will focus on issues related to efficiency, effectiveness, value, and behavior in the production and consumption of health care. You will have the opportunity to examine current trends and historical perspectives in the health care industry to explain its unique economic structure, while applying critical thinking skills to analyze systemic impacts of the behavior of individuals, health care providers, public and private organizations, and governments. This course also requires you to evaluate and discuss current public policies and reimbursement systems and their impacts on the overall health care system.

Project Overview

Unit 3:

This assignment represents the first component of your course project. Write a paper that includes the following:

- Provide a historical overview of the evolution of how health care has been reimbursed.
- Differentiate between fee for service versus managed care models of reimbursement.
- Discuss how fee-for-service and managed care models have contributed to the high cost of insurance premiums to employers and individuals.
- Differentiate between how hospitals and physicians are reimbursed including government entitlements such as Medicare and Medicaid.
- Recommend potential reform on how hospitals and physicians can be reimbursed, include how you might reform government entitlements such as Medicare and Medicaid. Base your recommendations on the reading and research you have conducted.

The paper must be formatted as follows:

- 3–5 pages of text, double spaced.
- A minimum of 6–8 outside references required.
- Citations must appear within the body of your paper to correspond with the references listed at the end of the paper (i.e., if the resource is included in your Reference List, the resource must be cited in your paper).
- Use Times New Roman 12-point font.

Unit 5:

This assignment represents the second component of your course project. In this installment you will provide the following:

- Identify and analyze how politics has influenced health care economics in the U.S.
- Identify one alternative, non-U.S.-based health care economic model (choose from Canada, Great Britain, Germany, or Japan).
- Identify and analyze how politics has influenced health care economics on the non-U.S.-based model you chose.
- Compare the U.S. health care model to the non-U.S. model you chose.

The paper must be formatted as follows:

- 3–5 pages of text, double spaced.
- A minimum of 6–8 outside references required.
- Citations must appear within the body of your paper to correspond with the references listed at the end of the paper (i.e., if the resource is included in your Reference List, the resource must be cited in your paper).
- Use Times New Roman 12-point font.

Unit 8:

This assignment represents the third component of your course project. In this written paper you will provide the following:

- Analyze how physicians and hospitals have negotiated service contracts with third party payers.
- Discuss how fee for service versus managed care models of reimbursement have contributed risk avoidance in their contract negotiations.
- Recommend future strategies for physicians and hospitals to effectively negotiate service delivery contracts. Base the recommendation on your research and readings.

The paper must be formatted as follows:

- 3–5 pages of text, double spaced.
- A minimum of 6–8 outside references required.
- Citations must appear within the body of your paper to correspond with the references listed at the end of the paper (i.e., if the resource is included in your Reference List, the resource must be cited in your paper).
- Use Times New Roman 12-point font.

Unit 10:

This assignment is a compilation of papers 1–3 for a final commentary on the economics and financing of health care delivery in the United States and a PowerPoint presentation that summarizes your paper.

Include the following:

- Provide an historical overview of health care reimbursement models including fee for service, Preferred Provider Organizations (PPOs), managed care and Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) configurations.
- Assess how each of these models has contributed to the cost of health care delivery. Include your comments with regard to deductibles, co-payments, and exclusions for pre-existing conditions.
- Assess how government entitlement programs such as Medicare and Medicaid have enabled or disabled the delivery of health care in the United States.
- Recommend how economics and financing of health care should be structured and why.

The paper must be formatted as follows:

- 7–9 pages of text, double spaced.
- A minimum of 10–12 outside references required.
- Citations must appear within the body of your paper to correspond with the references listed at the end of the paper (i.e., if the resource is included in your Reference List, the resource must be cited in your paper).
- Use Times New Roman 12-point font.

Include the following in your Power Point presentation:

- 10–12 PowerPoint Slides (bullets).
- Font size no larger than 36 or smaller than 20 within the slides.
- Final slide will include references used in developing the presentation.
- Avoid long sentences or paragraphs.
- Include a minimum of five graphic or visual enhancements to enhance the presentation and avoid a "narrative only" presentation.

Unit 1 >> Economics and the Uncertain Future of U.S. Healthcare

Introduction

In this first unit, we will examine the historical development of the U.S. health care delivery system while building a general framework for the study of health care economics. We will then discuss 10 key economic concepts and how health care professionals can effectively apply them to address the trade-off between cost, quality, and access of health care.

u01d1 - Cost, Quality and Access

Introduction

A key question that we will examine throughout this course is how health care professionals can effectively address the trade-off between cost, quality, and access of health care. What happens to quality and access when we attempt to make health care less expensive? If quality increases, must costs increase as well? If access is increased, what are the impacts on costs and overall quality?

- Investigate the concepts of the "Triple Aim" and the "Iron Triangle" and provide your thoughts on whether or not it is possible to have a low-cost, high-quality, wide-access health care system..
- Provide historical perspectives related to how the United States has addressed health care spending, delivery, and quality.

Include references in current APA style and format for all your sources.

Considering the overall complexity of economic theory, it may come as a surprise to some that a relatively small number of key concepts guide overall economic thought. This discussion will help you to become more familiar with these concepts.

Instructions

Given the key economic concepts of scarcity and choice, opportunity cost, marginal analysis, self-interest, markets and pricing, supply and demand, competition, efficiency, market failure, and comparative advantage, define your assigned concepts (below) and discuss their overall value to health care management professionals.

 - Scarcity and choice.
 - Opportunity cost.
 - Marginal analysis.
 - Self-interest.
- Learners with last names beginning with letters G–O, focus on the following economic concepts:
 - Markets and pricing.

- Learners with last names beginning with letters P–Z, focus on the following economic concepts:
 - Efficiency.
 - Market failure.
 - Comparative advantage.

Response Guidelines

In your responses, address the following:

- Comment on the connections your peers made between their assigned concepts and the value they provide to health care management professionals.

Introduction

A spending crisis within the health care field requires health care managers to continually search for ways to shift spending from services of minimal economic value to those with high cost-effectiveness or net savings. Prioritizing services that produce the greatest health benefits for the dollars spent is at the heart of economic evaluation.

u03a1 - Memo: Relevance of Health Care Economics

Preparation

Read the following scenario before completing this assessment. Feel free to conduct your own search in the Capella library and on the Internet to find scholarly or professional resources to support your discussion.

Scenario

In this scenario, assume you are in the role of a mid-level manager within a large health care organization. In order to support continuous improvement and career development, your organization requires you to annually choose a professional development focus, justify the relevance of this focus, and then set related goals for the knowledge you want to obtain.

To finalize this process, you must submit a detailed memo to the organization's human resource department detailing the above information. This year you have chosen to focus on the relevance of increasing your knowledge of and expertise in health care economics to your career as a health care manager.

Requirements

Write a formal 3–4-page business memorandum (memo) to submit to the human resource department. In your memo:

- Communicate your professional development focus by writing professional development goals focused on increasing your knowledge of health care economics from a health care management perspective.

- Communicate key concerns related to the uncertain future of health care in the United States, considering the trade-off between cost, quality, and access of health care and how economics can help you better prepare for these concerns as a health care manager.
- Discuss the relevance of key economic concepts to health care markets, systems, and health care professionals. Cover concepts such as scarcity and choice, opportunity cost, marginal analysis, self-interest, markets and pricing, supply and demand, competition, efficiency, market failure, and comparative advantage.
- Discuss how you plan to use and benefit from economic evaluation techniques in health care decision making.
- Identify and provide annotative detail on a variety of useful journals, professional associations, conferences, and other resources that would help you increase your knowledge of health care economics. The annotative details should explain why you chose the source (its value) and how it ties into your professional development goals.

Use language that will help to convince the human resource department that you have made a viable choice for your professional development. Write clearly, effectively, and professionally, using current APA style to cite and reference any resources used.

Additional Requirements

- **Written communication:** Should be clear, concise, well organized, and free of errors that detract from the overall message, as expected of a business professional.

Preparation

This assignment requires you to interview a health care manager to obtain and report information and insights about the market in which the manager practices. To prepare for this assessment:

1. Review the assignment requirements, below, and the scoring guide to understand what is required for this assessment.
2. Select a health care market (physician, hospital, or pharmaceutical) of interest to you.
3. Research the market and begin identifying the topics you want to focus on during your interview and the questions you plan to ask your interviewee.
4. Identify and secure an appointment to interview a health care manager in your selected market. Depending on the scope of your interview, plan to spend at least one hour in conversation. If possible, conduct the interview in person rather than by phone.
5. Finalize your interview questions.
6. Conduct the interview. Be sure to obtain permission from your interviewee if you want to record the conversation, and ask if you can contact the interviewee again if you need additional information or clarification.

Requirements

Once your interview has been completed, combine your research with the insight you gained from your interviewee in a 4- to 5-page business report that includes the following sections and content.

Title Page.

Include a standard title page.

Section 1 – Interviewee Introduction.

- Introduce your interviewee. Identify and describe the organization they work for and their position.
- Summarize your interviewee's background, including how they became interested in working in the health care field, how long they have worked in the field, their various positions in and out of the field, and their educational path.
- Discuss your interviewee's overall experience with economics and public policy and how often they use or are impacted by these in their day-to-day responsibilities.

Section 2 – Market Analysis (Physician, Hospital or Pharmaceutical).

- Analyze the health care market you chose, including significant historical events, its current issues, and future challenges.
 - Physician Market Topic Considerations: Physician shortages, defensive medicine, geographic distribution of physicians, how physicians respond to profit incentives.
 - Hospital Market Topic Considerations: Describe the different operating characteristics of the for-profit and the not-for-profit hospital. Is there a significant difference in quality and access between for-profit and not-for-profit hospitals?

- Pharmacy Market Topic Considerations: Impact of patents on drug prices, public concern regarding the industry's high profit margins, direct to consumer advertising, expenses of research and development, impact of price controls on the industry.
- From an economic perspective, discuss how health care managers can apply economic concepts, principles, and theories to better understand this market and its issues.
- From a public policy perspective, discuss current policies that impact this market and potential future policy initiatives related to this market.
- From a management perspective, discuss key business management challenges this market is facing. Consider impacts of the uninsured, how to best achieve efficiency, impacts of insurance, supply and demand, competition, cost vs. quality vs. access, and cost containment.

Scenario
