Title: Professional Ethics

Code: BS-MG 363

Credits: 3

Description: This course is an introductory study of ethical theory and practice. Classical ethical systems are assessed for their value in contemporary society. The role of ethics is examined in the context of personal, organizational, and societal behavior and decision making. Students will assess the compatibility of ethical systems and approaches from a Christian worldview. The applicability of popular ethical approaches are analyzed and their value in real world problem-solving scenarios are evaluated.

At the end of the course, you will be able to:

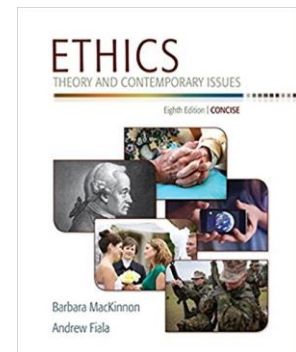
1. Understand the range of characteristics, concepts, and approaches to ethics and ethical theory.
2. Explain the role worldviews as it relates to ethics and decision making.
3. Describe the major classic ethical systems and understand how they are used in contemporary society.
4. Analyze the strengths and weaknesses of each classical ethical system.
5. Describe the unique characteristics of Christian ethics.
6. Describe how concepts of equality, fairness, and justice are applicable.
7. Analyze ethical approaches or systems in resolving real world issues.
8. Demonstrate the ability to understand and apply theory to support resolutions of ethical dilemmas.

Students are expected to post in the discussion board a **minimum of three separate posts** on three separate post dates per discussion thread. The three posts for **each** thread must include:

1. One "initial" post in response to the instructor's question (or stated assignment) no later than Thursday of each course week.
2. Two "follow-up" posts in response to at least one classmate by Sunday of each course week.

The initial response to a discussion question should substantively demonstrate familiarity with the content of the question. The response should be 150–200 words in length. To ensure the discussion is a collective and focused exploration of the topic in the question, the discussion thread should remain focused on the question.

The timing of responses is important since other students are dependent on your postings in order to fully develop the discussion and to post follow-up discussion entries. Responses should occur in the week the discussion question is posted for reply. Preparation for the response is encouraged to ensure a thoughtful and well-founded contribution to the discussion.

Each learner is expected to both respond initially (by Thursday each week) to the discussion question or assignment instruction posted by the instructor/facilitator each week and make at least two follow-up responses to other learners' postings in the discussion thread by the end of the week (Sunday at 11:59 p.m. ET). The purpose is to ensure an informed and thoughtful dialogue focused on the topic.

Supplemental Discussions

Each week will have a third Supplemental Discussion worth 15 points. These discussions will be based on videos, outside readings, and other means. These discussions will be a part of the Weekly Evaluations, so make sure to review the material thoroughly.

Content Requirements

The purpose of the final ethics assignment is to demonstrate the student's ability to understand and apply ethical theory and concepts in developing real world solutions. Students are to identify an ethical dilemma that is relevant and familiar to them and make recommendations for a potential solution based on the course content.

- Business students must identify a managerial or leadership ethical dilemma in an organizational context that they work for or select an organization with ample public data to complete this assignment.
- All other students can identify and select an ethical dilemma in any context that is relevant or of special interest. This includes social, environmental, cultural, or workplace scenarios.

Specific content:

1. Two or more classic ethical theories or approaches.
2. Christ centered biblical ethics.
3. Christian worldview.
4. Critical thinking skills that demonstrate a rational support for recommendations.
5. Problem based structure resulting in recommendations to potentially resolve an ethical dilemma (problem).
 - Identify an ethical dilemma (problem)
 - Background on problem.
 - Assess potential solutions from two or more ethical approaches.
 - Strengths and weaknesses of each approach for identified problem.
 - Final recommendations and support.
 - Lessons learned.
