Course Description

In this class, students will develop practical writing skills. Emphasis is on drafting and revising. Students may keep response journals, write short essays on a variety of topical subjects and study models of good writing. Emphasis is placed on student centered and writing-to-learn activities as well as collaborative and cooperative learning techniques. Lecture is also used at times. Teaching aids include power point presentations, videos, supplemental reading materials, and audio-files. Guest speakers may also be used to enhance student learning.

Students must have a grade of "C" or better to enroll in Comp 202. Credit Hours: 3

Course Objectives: This course will serve as a foundational course for you as it prepares you for academic writing. You will be introduced to a variety of writing models, which will help you develop your own particular writing style. You will discover that writing is truly a "process." You will go through this process with each paper you write. Grammar will be reviewed, which will help you polish your writing.
