Course Description

This course focuses on the development of writing skills for the healthcare professional, emphasizing writing as an academic skill necessary to prepare students for entering the healthcare field. The course contains a particular focus on cultivating empathy and developing cross-cultural sensitivity in healthcare environments. To prepare students for successful written communication in their chosen field, students will learn to write in a way that targets specific audience members, such as the patient, family members of the patient, and fellow healthcare professionals. The course also emphasizes questions and responses that stimulate thought, examine ethics, relate the material to broader universal issues, and necessitate critical interpretation. Students will be required to compile, organize, and logically present scientific and health information in research paper format, using citations and references. In addition, students will be expected to read literature related to healthcare issues and respond in journal and essay format.



Course Goal

Students will build on the reading, writing, and critical thinking skills acquired in English Composition through readings and assignments specifically designed for the healthcare professional.








Writing Assignments (50%): Each of the course's weekly writing assignments will offer you the opportunity to engage in a different kind of writing scenario. The feedback provided on these weekly writing assignments will guide you in your development as a writer. These assignments will also serve to reinforce the idea that writing is a process, allowing you to prepare for the semester's final research essay.



Discussion Board Participation (20%):

- The initial discussion questions will be provided each week.
- All students must post a response to the original discussion question by Thursday of each week.
- Students must then post two responses to each other's responses throughout the rest of the week – for a total of three postings per week.
- You are required to post on a minimum of two separate days per week. These are minimum requirements: you can post to each question as many times as you'd like.
- Each post should contribute to the discussion as well as illustrate that you have read the readings and have learned something from the readings and/or discussion thread.
- Your first post of the week should be a minimum of one paragraph in length and grammatically correct.
 All subsequent posts should be two to three sentences long and grammatically correct.
- Discussion board posts cannot be made up and close by midnight Sunday each week.

Research Essay (25%): The final research paper represents the culmination of those critical conversations and writing techniques studied throughout the semester.

Quizzes (5%): Each of the course's weekly quizzes will offer you the opportunity to demonstrate your understanding of a module's topic.

The finished essay must include: a formal thesis statement and academic language throughout; a clear beginning- middle-end structure with logical transitions; one outside source. Consult a scholarly article on decision-making strategy and describe whether or not your own personal experience corresponded with the perspective represented in the article. Correct APA-style citations.

What aspects of your personality have been influenced by your racial, ethnic, social, geographic, generational, economic, professional, or political affiliation? Have you "chosen" this culture? Prepare a reflective essay that considers the answers to these questions in context with both daily life and healthcare, providing clear examples. The finished essay must include: Three to five paragraphs, clear structure, Both an example from the weekly reading and one additional source of research (a formal source discussing culture in society) is required. The subject of the paper must relate to healthcare and it must be a concern that is topical or current. Identify a significant healthcare concern and then explore what is happening regarding that topic in modern medicine. You can also further explore areas examined in previous weeks, such as how culture influences healthcare etc. Though your personal experiences may provide the motivation for your topic choice, the paper will be an objective research paper with no use of personal examples or narratives - no use of personal stories or pronouns in the content. Case studies from research can be used. Use at least three academic sources and adhere to APA format. It must be typed in 12-point Times New Roman font,
