Course Description:

In this course the student is introduced to the language and conventions of modern French; a language used widely throughout the world and close to home in Maine's neighboring bilingual provinces of Quebec and Atlantic Canada. Making use of class instruction and audio-taped dialogs, students in practice dialog sessions expand their knowledge of the idiom.

Course Objectives:

- Interpersonal Communication: Student can communicate on some very familiar topics using single words and phrases.
- Presentational Speaking: Student can present information about him/herself and other very familiar topics using single words or memorized phrases.
- Writing: Student can write lists and memorized phrases on familiar topics.
- Listening: Student can recognize some familiar words and phrases when I hear them spoken.
- Reading: Student can recognize letters or characters and can understand some learned or memorized words and phrases when reading.
- Culture: Students can demonstrate an initial awareness and appreciation of French-speaking
 cultures around the world by describing at least one aspect of cultural life, history, or current
 events.

Evaluation and Grading:

Grades will be determined from a variety of activities that will include participation in classroom discussions, reading, writing and listening exercises. Class participation is of utmost importance as language acquisition requires active participation. Exercises and homework to reinforce what is being studied in class will be assigned, completed and submitted in MindTap. Exams will be assigned and completed online or in class. Students will choose a region where French is used a complete a cultural project on his/her chosen region. Full details about this project will be provided by the instructor when the project is assigned.
