# **Syllabus**

**HCA-420:** Finance for Healthcare Administrators

### **Course Description**

Students in this course will evaluate the current system of financing healthcare and the factors affecting it, analyze cost measurement and allocation processes, and determine the organization's financial condition and potential for the future. Students will analyze budgetary concepts and the differences between the goods and service industries and determine the pros and cons of single payer vs. third party systems. A biblical worldview will be integrated throughout the course.
