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**BIL-304:** Johannine Literature

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#### Course Description

This is a study of the Gospel of John and the three Epistles. Such concepts as Logos, truth, life, light, and love will be given special attention. Other topics include the role of the church and the Holy Spirit, implications for reading the Johannine Literature today, and John Wesley's use of the Johannine Literature.

Credit Hours: 3

Prerequisite Courses: BIL203, or permission of the program director

- 1. Outline the logical flow and content of the Johannine Literature.
- 2. Examine the composition of the Gospel of John.
- 3. Explain the unique characteristics of the theology of the Johannine Literature.
- 4. Employ inductive Bible Study skills to interpret key themes in the Johannine Literature.
- 5. Analyze the role of the church and the Holy Spirit as presented within the Johannine Literature.
- 6. Critically examine John Wesley's use of the Johannine Literature in some of his sermons.
- 7. Apply passages and themes in Johannine literature to ministry or spiritual formation.
