ENG 360 – Interdisciplinary Professional and Technical Writing (W) – Online

Course Information

This course introduces students to the theories and practices of effective written communication in professional and technical fields. Students will develop skills in document design, use of graphics, and appropriate technical writing styles for print and digital documents. Students will also develop rhetorical strategies for writing for particular audiences. Prerequisites: ENG 111 and ENG 112. Each semester.

Course Learning Objectives

1. Define a document's purpose, format, context of use and genre.
2. Develop a triangulated research strategy that manages information and builds knowledge from primary sources, electronic sources, print sources, and empirical sources.
3. Recognize special problems and particular techniques of professional, technical, and scientific writing.
4. Design documents for print and digital environments that enhance readability, support text and incorporate effective design and visual components.

“Contact Hours”

This is a 4-credit course, offered in accelerated format. This means that 16 weeks of material is covered in 8 weeks. Participation & Attendance

Late Work:

All work is due at the beginning of the class period of the due date indicated on the course calendar. Missed in-class assignments cannot be made up. Late assignments must be submitted via email so they have a time and date stamp.

Assignments submitted late will earn a late deduction according to the following schedule (note: each 10% deduction represents one full letter grade):

- Submitted same day (by 11:59 p.m.) but after the class period begins=5% deduction
- Midnight of due date to 24 hours late=10% deduction
- 1-3 days late=20% deduction
- 4-7 days late=30% deduction
- Beyond one week late, no late work will be accepted.

The context and medium of your message dictate the most appropriate and effective format/design of your document. If outside sources are used, then cite using either APA or MLA.
