

Academic Honesty:

Any student detected of cheating or engaging in plagiarism on any exam or paper, or participating in any other form of academic dishonesty, will receive the appropriate sanctions, which can include a failing grade ("F") for the course. Course Deletions/Additions:

Email:

Assignments

The instructor reserves the right to make adjustments to the grading criteria. Any late assignments will lose points.

APA Style Writing QUIZ (25 points)

Each student will take a basic APA style QUIZ. You will need the APA manual to learn the basics of APA style.

Research Journal Article Project (25 points)

Each student will use the McKendree Holman Library

Website to find a peer-reviewed psychology journal article that reports an empirical research study (i.e., it presents new data). Each student will complete a brief summary of the selected article. They will also discuss the conclusions that can be drawn from the research study. This is submitted as an ASSIGNMENT in the module!

Advising/Resume/Action Plan JOURNAL (25 points)

Each student will print out their program evaluation and create a 2, 3, or 4 year plan plotting out ALL classes they plan to take to graduate. Each student will also complete a resume and an action plan of 5 things each student plans to do to prepare for graduate school or careers in the next two years. Put this information all into an Action Plan JOURNAL. Your journal will have your class plan, your resume, and your action plan for a total of 3 parts or 3 pieces.

Service Learning BLOG (25 points)

Participate in a service project or volunteer activity.

Complete a BLOG post about when and where you went, what you did and what you learned. You may utilize the Lyn Huxford Center for Service to help you find good locations if you wish. Clearly state how your experience is related to psychology. Ideally it would be best to volunteer in an area you may interested in for future careers.

Final POWER POINT PRESENTATION (25 points)

Each student will create a power point on one of the following topics (approximately 5-10 slides with 5 references on last slide):

- 1.) Psychology Career (Information about education, experience, income, duties, job market, etc.)
- 2.) Graduate School (Admission information, classes, programs, pre-requisites, pros, cons, etc.)
- 3.) Other topic of interest (Must be approved by instructor)
