Participation Policy:	Course participation will be monitored and verified for all students during the semester. Each student is expected to meet course expectations by completing the coursework required and on time!
	Active participation and staying abreast of the material is essential to success in the class.  Study after study has linked successful academic performance with good class participation.  Students who assume positions of responsibility must "show up" in order to be effective.  Students are expected to be attentive to the course content by completing assigned readings, and submitting all work on course assignments in a complete and timely fashion.
	To succeed in this class, you must be a good manager of your time. Students who fall behind in this class, struggle to catch up and often receive a failing grade in the end.
Discussion Board	At the beginning of each week I will submit a discussion board question that each student must respond to with a substantial reply. Each student must submit a quality response to the question by Wednesday of that week. Additionally, each student must respond to two different student's post by Sunday at 11:55 pm. The initial response to the question and the responses to the other posts must be significant and more than stating that you agree or disagree. Typically the initial post and subsequent responses should be at least a few sentences
	long! Each one of the responses will be worth 20 points for a total of 60 points. For a grading purposes, the discussion board weekly point count will be divided by six for a max of 10 points (60/6=10). There will be no late submissions on the responses. Further criteria for the responses can be found in the handouts section of the class page under the title: "Discussion Rubric". In addition, on the first week each student will have to reply to my welcome announcement and introduction. This activity will be worth an additional 10 points.
Quizzes	Each week there will be an online quiz worth 20 points (20 multiple choice questions). The quizzes are directly driven from the reading assignments of each week (see above). Based on the schedule above, each week you will have seven days to take the quiz. The following are some key facts about the online quizzes:  • Please read the chapters before taking the online quiz since you will be allowed
	<ul> <li>only one attempt!</li> <li>Per week and for each student, quiz questions will be different! The computer chooses a different set of questions for each student from a pool of questions.</li> <li>You will be allowed only 30 minutes per quiz. When the 30 minutes are up, the quiz will be submitted automatically for grading.</li> </ul>
Exams	Every other week there will be an online exam worth 50 points (50 multiple choice questions).  Each exam will cover four or five chapters. Based on the schedule above, you will have seven days to take each exam. The following are some key facts about the online exams:  • Please read the chapters before taking the online exam since you will be allowed only one attempt!  • Per exam and for each students, exam questions will be different! The computer
	chooses a different set of questions for each student from a pool of questions.
	You will be allowed <u>only 60 minutes</u> per exam. When the 60 minutes are up, the test will be submitted automatically for grading.
