REL 101: Introduction to Religion (3 semester hours)

Course Description:

This course is an analytical and topical examination of religious traditions, beliefs, and socio-religious interaction throughout human history. In this class we will also distinguish between *religion* and *theology* as the two fields are often, yet incorrectly, conflated. We will examine various religious traditions with particular attention given to the Judeo-Christian tradition.

Course Objectives:

- 1) Understand the difficulties in defining and conceptualizing "religion" and how a variety of prominent thinkers have approached the topic.
- 2) Master the rudiments of practice and belief in several of the world's largest religious traditions.
- 3) Develop a solid grasp of the phenomenological approach to studying religion.
- 4) Clearly articulate your ideas and construct persuasive arguments.
- 5) Critically analyze a wide range of sources.
- 6) Learn what it means to study religion as an academic discipline, rather than in a confessional or apologetic setting.

ASSIGNMENTS:

I. Midterm Religious Excursus:

Students will draw from assigned readings, class notes and supplementary materials a basis of research from which a 3-4 page paper will be written. Topics include, but are not limited to (a) A World Religion, (b) One Dimension of a Particular Religion or (c) How particular institutions (governments, businesses, communities, etc.) engage religious traditions. (Example: Chaplaincy in the U.S. Armed Forces).

It is important that your excursus treat study of religion as a branch of the humanities and the social sciences. This means that affirmations of faith, as would be discussed in a theological course, are not what is being evaluated. This paper should take as objective and analytical view of religion as possible.

II. Critical Analysis in Context:

Via the use of the three multimedia clips, our class will view various examples of religious expression as typified by our assigned readings and lectures toward the end of freewriting and sharing initial reactions

to said presentations. This freewriting assignment is to be HANDWRITTEN, scanned and uploaded to the Student Portal. The links to the three multimedia clips can be found under the Resources heading at the end of this syllabus.

III. Final Religious Excursus:

The Midterm Excursus will be graded and feedback will be provided to the students for 3 purposes: **Revision:** Any necessary changes in the structure of the Midterm submission should be reflected in the Final submission. **Expansion:** Whereas the Midterm Excursus is 3-4 pages in the length, the Final excursus should be a minimum of 5 pages not to exceed 7 pages. These pages do not include the required Works Cited page. **Corrections:** Any errant information, data or research should be corrected. A minimum of THREE Turabian or Chicago Style citations from your required textbook must be used in the Final submission.
