Saint Leo University CRM 422 Law Enforcement Systems

Course Description:

This course provides a comprehensive examination of U.S. law enforcement systems at the federal, state, and local levels. The student should gain an understanding of patrol strategies, field training, detective operations, case screening, crime laboratory, police corruption, use of force, due process issues, community relations, law enforcement information systems, professionalism, job stress, and innovations in policing.

Case Studies

The Case Studies will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- 1. **Thoroughness**: Extensively develop the issue presented in the Case Study. Show depth and understanding of the subject, and apply it to current local agency practices. The paper must clearly identify its focus and logically analyze and discuss the topic.
- 2. **Scholarly quality**: The assignment must meet acceptable college level standards with respect to form and substance. Present the ideas in a clear, concise manner. The paper is in correct format with little to no typographical, spelling, or grammatical errors. (Note: Each error deducts points off the grade.)

Submit each Case Study to the assignment box **no later than Sunday 11:59 PM EST/EDT in Modules 2, 3, 5, and 6**. (These Assignment box may be linked to Turnitin.)

Research Paper

Select a topic and develop a research paper relating to one of the law enforcement systems operating in the United States of America. In the Research Paper, make a connection between the selected topic and the core value of responsible stewardship. In addition, describe the characteristics/behaviors, past/historical information, and present/future needs.

The Research Paper must include at least 5 scholarly resources, and APA formatting is required with use of the latest APA Manual. Additionally, the paper must be between 1,200 and 1,500 words, not including title page, and references.

Submit the Research Paper Topic to the Assignment box no later than 11:59 PM EST/EDT of Module 2.

Submit the Research Paper to the Assignment box **no later than 11:59 PM EST/EDT of Module 7**. (This Assignment box may be linked to Turnitin.)
