LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon completion of this course the student should be able to:

1. Distinguish between the major models used to integrate, prevent, maintain, intervene, and rehabilitate consumers as well as identify generic concepts of human services
2. Classify modern human services in a historical context;
3. Demonstrate the roles and skills of human services entry-level professionals and workers;
4. Describe human services problems and the range and characteristics of human services delivery systems and boundaries of the field;
5. Analyze strategies, theories, and knowledge bases that have been used traditionally to treat people in need;
6. Discuss new strategies for helping people in need that are most closely identified with a human services approach or a political and ideological approach;
7. Evaluate ethical and legal issues that affect human services workers and begin to develop conscious use of self and application of Saint Leo Core Values of **Community** and **Respect**.

METHODS OF ASSESSMENT

Discussion and Participation Grade (10%)

Short Essay Quiz – (5%)

Each student is expected to attend class regularly and actively participate in the class sessions by speaking and giving feedback to others. Quizzes will be given periodically on the assigned readings, Internet assignments and class lab exercises. In-class exercises will teach about the history of the helping professions, the beginning of the field of human services, the role workers are assigned to in the agencies, the different types of treatment available, the current issues and problems consumers bring to the agencies, and the populations the students can expect to encounter. Discussions will center around skills needed to work with individuals, groups, families, and the community when residents are struggling with poverty, unemployment, illness, substance abuse, domestic violence, mental illness, disability, or aging issues to name just a few. Students will learn how to apply the NOHS ethical standards as well as the Saint Leo Core Values of Community and Respect.

Mid-term Examination – (15%)

You will be tested on material you have learned in the text and in the class such as information on human services history, current social problems, various populations that need services, knowledge and skills in service delivery, treatment interventions like case management, intake interviewing, individual counseling, group facilitation, resource and referral or any other human service approaches.

Career Interest Paper - (25%)

Despite its low weight, don't let this assignment fool you. It might be the most important assignment of all. Think about all that you have learned about being a professional human services worker. What area of human services would you be most interested in working? Think about the special populations and distinct settings. What assets and values do you bring to the profession? What area of human services interests you the least? What personal or professional characteristics do you feel you need to improve in order to become a human services worker? As a human service professional practicing in the field, it is vital to know which social welfare programs could help your clients. Briefly discuss how social welfare programs have helped many people. Discuss how community organizing can bring about social change. **3-4 pages in length, typed, doubled-spaced, legible. This is a self-awareness paper, but 3-4 references should be used to strengthen the paper. Use of the course text is required. Address chapters you have studied, or you have read in the text. A written reference page is required. APA referencing is required.**

Agency Paper and Volunteer Assignment (25%)

Students are asked to visit a local human services agency to interview an agency supervisor and then volunteer five (5) hours if the agency allows volunteers. Agency settings may include food banks, services for the elderly, children, teens, or community centers, schools, day care centers, churches, Salvation Army, Goodwill, etc. A statement on agency letterhead indicating the student has completed the volunteer hours/interview, is required to be completed and then turned in with the student paper. Students will write a reaction paper reflecting the information they have gained. After interviewing the agency supervisor, students will write a 5-page paper about what they have learned. Consider the agency setting, type and age of population served, services provided, roles of social service professionals employed there, education needed to work there, salary range for social service professionals, and job opportunities. Include 2 peer reviewed academic references in your writing assignment. Be sure to apply and incorporate the course Saint Leo University core values of community and respect to the field of human services and two ethical standards from the Ethical Standards for Human Service Professionals (from the Responsibility to Clients section) in your paper. Discuss your observations. Was the agency well maintained? Did clients (if observable) look at ease? Did employees appear happy and client focused? Does the organization meet its organizational mission and vision? You are encouraged to use the Saint Leo University online library to provide additional research for your paper as well as using your course text. **A letter to the agency describing this assignment will be given to you by your instructor so that you can provide a written introduction.**

Agency Presentation (5%)

The PowerPoint presentation must provide a historical overview of the organization's human services historical development. What is the organizational mission and vision statement? In addition, the required components of the agency paper must be incorporated. Students must present a professional presentation. Create a 5-8 slide PowerPoint to address the paper requirements. Make sure to dress professionally. Note: This assignment is based on the Agency Paper. Due week 8

Final Examination (15%)

You will be tested on material you have learned in the text and in the class such as human services history, current social problems, various populations that need services, knowledge and skills in service delivery, treatment interventions like case management, intake interviewing, individual counseling, group facilitation, resource and referral, or any other human services approaches.
