## **Course Description**

This course focuses upon the theoretical development and challenges of effective leadership by reviewing the historical development of various early leadership theories including: Great Man, Trait, Contingency, Transformational, Transactional, Behavioral, Participative, and Servant Leadership.

### **Course Overview**

This course builds on LDRS 2123 Principled Leadership, though it can be taken before or after. We will review and apply major theories of leadership to our personal lives and various situations and organizations. Theories include: Authentic, Servant, Adaptive, Followership, and the issues surrounding ethics, teamwork, gender, and culture in leadership. We will read writings of numerous leaders, connecting them to the leadership concepts.

### **Course Workload**

Time spent on course assignments will vary by student depending on familiarity with course content, reading rate of speed, writing rate of speed, and other individual factors. Based on averages for most students, it is estimated that the course workload estimate for this course is 10 hours per week.

## **Description**

#### Written:

Initial post and self-assessment survey. Take the survey as outlined in the instructions. Sometimes they are personal, just evaluating yourself or someone else. Other times they ask you to have other people take the survey about you. Connect what you discover to the leadership concepts in the book. Quote and cite Northouse as you make your connections. Put your write-up and self-assessment results in the DF initial post. t least 300 words.

- Respond to two classmates' initial posts. Comment on what they wrote. Ask them a follow-on question (at least seven (7) sentences).
- Reply to at least two peers and your professor, answering their questions (at least five (5) sentences).
- Finally, acknowledge to each person that you have read their final post.

#### Live Sessions:
