Course Description

This course is an introduction to the artistic expression of human experience through music. This will be accomplished via instruction on perceptive listening, analytical skills, and research in order to not only heighten student appreciation of the qualities and characteristics of Western music, but also to demonstrate how deeply entrenched it is in our everyday lives. Elements of visual art, poetry, and architecture will also be addressed throughout the course and connected to music of the same time periods.

Discussions - 10%

There will be three discussion prompts over the course of the semester. Peer reviews/responses are not required, but the prompts must be addressed in their entirety.

*Concert Reports/Creative Project - 30%

Students will take in and analyze either two concerts using terminology learned in Part 1 of the text, **OR** analyze one concert and create a piece of music using BandLab. Links to concerts and further information are posted in the Resources module.

Tests (on Reading, Viewing, and Listening) – 40%

Each student will complete a weekly test, which will cover text reading and listening examples.

Listening Quizzes - 20%

Each chapter (chapter--not week) includes one listening quiz to be completed by the end of each week. Students are strongly encouraged to complete listening quizzes as they complete each chapter. Some weeks will have more listening quizzes than others--be sure to plan accordingly!
