## Design for Multimedia Instruction and Digital Media

#### Discussions/Video Discussions – 20%

This course will consist of a combination of written and video discussions. The student is required to post at least three video discussions. It may be your initial post or a response to a classmate.

In an online learning community, discussions are imperative to both the success of the individual student as well as the greater good of the group. Therefore, monitoring and engagement of the discussion thread throughout the window are expected. Through interactions with peers and the instructor, the student will question, encourage, promote critical thinking, elaborate, clarify, probe, and prompt. Personal examples and resources should be openly shared. The discussion forum is a safe place, and professionalism and Christian ethic of care is expected. Some examples include:

- Suggest why you might see things differently.
- Ask a probing or clarifying question.
- Share an insight from having read the colleague's posting.
- Offer and support an opinion.
- Validate an idea with your own experience.
- Make a suggestion.
- Expand on the colleague's posting.
- Ask for evidence that supports the posting.

The instructor has only what the student posts to determine preparation and level of understanding. Therefore, it is imperative that the student clearly states responses to the prompts, including personal experiences, connections to course resources (readings, videos, etc.), and questions related to further exploration or application of the topic.

The following format must be used for online discussions:

The initial post is due Thursday by 11:59 PM/EST

Monitoring and engagement through replies to peers plus instructor must be evident throughout the window: Initial post Thursday; interactions Friday OR Saturday; interactions on Sunday. Failure to interact and/or respond will result in a lower grade. Submitting the minimum number of posts does not automatically mean a maximum number of points.

#### **Multimedia Instructional Video Project - 20%**

Create a Multimedia Instructional Video presentation about a topic that you're passionate about. The video must be between 1 to 5 minutes in length, including audio and visual aids. Explore the different types of technology available. There are a lot of free tools.

- Screen Capture (ScreenCast-O-Matic.com)
- Video Camera (cell phones, tablet, and PC webcams)

The video should be uploaded to a shared environment for review and grading. This could include (your online module created during EDUC 6033, a link to a Blog, Padlet, Google Drive, YouTube, DropBox, etc.) Submit the instruction for viewing and link to your video in the assignment link within Canvas.

### **Animated Instructional Project - 20%**

Create an animated digital presentation using tools like Voki and Animaker. These sites provide opportunities to create avatars to engage learners of all ages. The presentation may consist of an introduction to your Distance Education Project, welcome video, self bio, etc. This is your opportunity to be creative and allow your personality to shine. You may record/upload your voice or select voices provided by the software if available for video narration. The video should be between 1-2 minutes in length.

The video should be uploaded to a shared environment for review and grading. This could include (your online module created during EDUC 6033, a link to a Blog, Padlet, Google Drive, YouTube, DropBox, etc.) Submit the instruction for viewing and link to your video in the assignment link within Canvas.

### Hybrid Learning Environment Lesson Plan - 20%

The final project is divided into two parts. Part 1 is to create a Hybrid Learning Lesson Plan about a topic, subject, or issue of your choosing. Consider catering it to your chosen profession. Part one is to create the lesson plan to include the following sections:

- Lesson Context (Description/Topic of your lesson)
- Target Outcomes (Target outcomes)
- Target Audience (General demographics)
- Medium/Online Elements (technology used, select technology that you have some interest in that you may want to use in your classroom or training sessions.)
- Face-to-Face Elements (In-class activity)
- Storyboard (Step by step instructions of how the learners will access and move through the lesson)
- Assessments (Forms of assessments/assessment tools)

Submit this assignment using the assignment link in Canvas.

### **Hybrid Learning Environment Implementation - 20%**
