Syllabus Confirmation Quiz-5 points

To help guide students through the syllabus and course expectations students will be expected to watch a syllabus introduction video and then complete a brief quiz confirming that they have watched the video and understand the expectations of the course.

Reading Journals-245 points

You are responsible for reading the assigned chapters each week and taking thorough, handwritten notes on the material. For each chapter you should have at least 3 pages of handwritten notes. Your notes should be a combination of summary (in your own words) and reflection/questions (what was significant? what did you not understand? etc).

At the end of each sub-section of the chapter there is a Personal Application Question. Select 1 of the questions from the chapter that most interests you and write 1 full paragraph at the end of your notes on that chapter addressing the question. Please write the question before your answer so I know which question you are answering. There should be one PAQ response for each assigned chapter.

All work in your reading journal should be your own.

You will be required to post your notes to Canvas by Sunday. Detailed directions for submitting this assignment can be found on Canvas. The grading rubric below will be used to assess your journals.

Discussion Questions- 350 points

Each week there will be TWO discussion questions posted. Students will be required to post a 250 word response to DQ1 and DQ2 by Saturday. In addition, they will need to post at least one 150 word response to a classmate by Saturday. There will be a prompt provided to guide the posts. Given that each week will have different content the specific assignment directions will be posted within the discussion assignment.

The weekly discussion post will be the attendance assignment for students. Student's not posting to the discussion forum will be marked absent for that week.

There will be 2 comprehensive tests. Test 1 will occur during week 4. Test 2 will occur during week 7. Tests will be multiple choice questions. Each test will cover only the material from that unit. Tests will be open notes/book. The tests will be timed so students are encouraged to prepare for the tests as if they were closed book/notes.

Course Policies

Attendance Policy
