COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is a study of the prophetic movement in ancient Israel and its historical background in antiquity; attends to the ethics and theology of the prophets and their concern with the problems of justice in society.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: The objectives of this course is to introduce students to the prophets of the Old Testament; the situations that caused them to prophesy; the political and religious climate of their day; and what role prophecy played in the rise and fall of the state of Israel.

prophets; the Fall of the Northern Kingdom

UNIT III THE 7TH CENTURY PROPHETS: Students will demonstrate

knowledge of the prophets who prophesied during the 7th century; the political and religious climates during that period; and the

content of the message

UNIT IV THE 6TH CENTURY PROPHETS: Students will demonstrate

knowledge of the prophets who prophesied during the 6th century; the political and religious climates during that period; the content of the message; the Fall of the Southern Kingdom and Babylonian

Exile.

UNIT V THE 5TH CENTURY PROPHETS: Students will demonstrate

knowledge of the content and message of the 5^{th} century prophets;

the Restoration Period; and the emphasis on identity.

UNIT VI THE FEMALE PROPHETS: The bible mentions 5 prominent

women as "prophets" and their contribution to bringing salvation to the people of Israel and the nations. Students will be made aware that there were both male and female prophets in the biblical

period.
