

POL201 Political Geography (3 credit hours) Syllabus

Course Description

This course emphasizes the relationships among the physical environment, landforms, climate, resources, and political boundaries. Students will compare the importance of geography to the current political map of the world. Students will learn to identify continents, countries, capitals, and major cities.

By the end of this course, the student will be able to do the following:

- 1. Identify and differentiate the geography of the world.
- 2. Explain the implications of geography on political boundaries.
- 3. Analyze the current world political climate as it relates to geography
- 4. Using the knowledge gained from the class discussions and written material, critically assess the implications of the world's geographic boundaries and appraise through communicating your views effectively with the spoken and written word in a logical and precise manner.
