Course Description: A study of the psychological and sociological factors relating to the problems of addiction. Special attention will be given to the effects which alcohol and other drugs have upon fetuses, children, adults, families, and communities.

Learning Outcomes: Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Examine the dominant beliefs and attitudes in our society with regard to chemical use, abuse, and addiction. LO1
- 2. Define the characteristics of the major classes of drugs. LO2
- 3. Identify and summarize the addiction process and the characteristics thereof. LO3
- 4. Explain the effects of addiction on individual, family, and community. LO4
- 5. Outline and critique current intervention and treatment modalities used in the field. LO5

Course Requirements:

Submit all assignments using Microsoft Word (.doc or .rtf). Use 1" margins and 12-point font and follow APA (7th edition) layout and citation style for all narrative assignments.

Articles and/or research projects should be prepared in narrative (essay) APA style format using personal reflections, backed up by definitions and examples from the textbook and trustworthy sources, cited appropriately using APA citation format.

Written Assignments: The documents must be typed, double spaced with in-text citations. In addition, all material must be sited according to APA requirements. See the Writing Assignment Rubric in COURSE INFORMATION.

Forum Board: This is a two-part process. Each student must post 1 substantial comment to the forum each week before Wednesday midnight. The student must also submit a substantive reply to a minimum of two other students before midnight on Saturday. Discussion Board postings are worth 30% of your final grade and must be completed by Saturday of the week it is due. Each post must be more than 200 words and contain a well thought out response or partial credit will be

given. Online discussions require students to post comments, read the writings of other students, and reply with statements that include complete sentences and connect to the original posting. Students are expected to make a thoughtful response to at least 2 students each week. See the Discussion Forum Rubric in COURSE INFORMATION.

Quiz: There are a variety of quizzes included in this course: H5P Crosswords H5P Word Link, Essay, and 1 Multiple Choice exercise.

PowerPoint Assignment: This will be your midterm. See COURSE INFORMATION for additional details.

Infographic: This will be your Final.

Other Policies:

Academic Misconduct:
