Discussion Boards

The purpose of the Discussion Board is not only to generate points towards your final grade. It is so that students can share perspectives and references with each other to better understand the "big picture." Therefore, it will enhance your learning if you will read each other's postings and reply to them.

Discussion Board questions are posted and will be available for the corresponding week that the chapter is covered. Discussion Board questions should be reviewed daily. All students are to initially post their response to the question and then respond by posting to at least two other class members postings. Do not post as an attachment.

- Each of your discussion topics (5) replies are a possible 20 points.
- Substantive postings go beyond "I agree" or "I see your point". Substantive postings link Lifespan concepts to personal experience/opinion.
- Read and consider your classmates' postings, and respond constructively.
 Offer personal experiences relevant to the discussion only. You must reply to 2 other students in order to receive full credit.
- You are expected to be courteous when responding to one another. The use
 of foul language, bashing, ridiculing, or responding in a threatening manner
 will not be tolerated and will be cause for removal from the class. This is a
 time to practice diplomacy.
- Please do not wait until the last day to post. You are not giving the other students the opportunity to read, comment or reply to your posting if you submit it right before the expiration time. All topics will be open for postings until the expiration day & time so that you may go ahead and post as early as you wish on each topic.

- All exams will be multiple-choice. You will have 90 minutes to complete 50 multiple-choice questions.
- All exams will be based on the material from the lecture modules and textbook.
- All exams will be available until the deadline posted.
