Course Goals and Content

The goals of this course are to analyze business strategies in order to recognize how technology solutions enable strategic outcomes, to identify information systems requirements by analyzing business processes, and to enable the student to gain experience solving real world business problems using different information systems applications. Course content will include an overview of management information systems and how they provide value by supporting organizational objectives. Various concepts of business processes and alignment of information systems solutions to strategic goals are covered. The technical, business, and management aspects of management information systems are examined through the study of MIS theory and concepts.

7. Understand the roles and responsibilities associated with information systems management

Participation and Grading

The most effective online courses aren't self-paced independent studies but highly interactive, collaborative learning environments where we can hold in-depth conversations, ask hard questions, and share our work in progress—just as we would if we were meeting in a classroom. Being successful in an online course at Wesleyan requires careful time management, attention to detail, a willingness to ask for help when you need it, and the ability to read detailed instructions and work independently.

Because we won't be meeting together in a traditional classroom, you'll be responsible for participating and demonstrating your understanding of course material in different ways: through our weekly Live Chat sessions, Discussion Forums, and online assignments. To ensure that you're participating fully and successfully in this course, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Live Chats: I'll offer one real-time meeting in our virtual Zoom classroom each week. These Live Chat sessions are a vital opportunity for you to ask questions, ensure you're on track with your work, and collaborate with your classmates and me—just as you would in a face-to-face classroom.
 - You should join each Live Chat on time and prepared to participate fully in class discussions and collaborative activities. Always have on hand your textbook and any other required materials. Frequent tardiness, absences, low participation, and/or unpreparedness may result in a lower course grade.
 - Live Chat attendance is flexible but missing a Live Chat session is the same as missing class time. Please be aware you're responsible for all information, instructions, and discussion points covered during the sessions regardless of whether you attended.
 - You'll be required to have your video on during Live Chats. Your peers and I want to see you, not a blank screen! Having your video enabled helps us to get to know and connect with each other. It also allows me to see your facial expressions, which can be invaluable in letting me know if you're confused about something (or bored!). I'll certainly understand if you need to briefly disable your video to run to the bathroom, answer the door, tend to a crying child (or spouse/partner/pet!) etc., but please otherwise have your video turned on.
 - If you're unable to attend a weekly Live Chat session, you should plan to review the recording
 and complete a Live Chat Exit Ticket by the end of the week (Thursday at 11:59 PM) in order
 to receive credit for that week's Chat.
 - I'll post a link to the recording of that week's Live Chat within a few hours after the Live Chat in that week's module.
 - o The Live Chat Exit Ticket is set up as a Quiz in that week's module.
- **Communication**: You should initiate communication with me when **help or extensions** are needed and resolve any technical issues as soon as possible.

- Email: You should check your Wesleyan email daily and respond to my email requests within 24 hours.
- Time: Every week you'll have reading and assignments to be completed. As a rule of thumb, you should expect to spend 7–8 hours each week participating in forum discussions, attending (or reviewing the recordings of) Live Chat sessions, studying independently, and completing homework. Be sure to plan your weekly schedule carefully to ensure you have adequate time to complete course activities and assignments thoroughly and on time.
- Meeting scheduled deadlines is essential. You're expected to submit assignments in a timely and regular fashion without reminders from me. Don't wait until the last minute to begin the week's work because computer problems, last minute emergencies, and sudden outages do happen!
